

Bahman Guyuron, MD, FACS Brief Biography

Dr. Bahman Guyuron completed a residency in general surgery at Boston University, plastic surgery at The Cleveland Clinic Foundation, and craniofacial surgery at Toronto University.

After serving as the Division Chief for 14 months and chairing the Department that he founded for 10 years at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine, he continues his educational mission as an Emeritus Professor.

Over the last 20 years, he has captured the attention of the medical and surgical communities with the development of the surgical treatment of migraine headaches, with over 67 peer-reviewed publications and the book *Migraine Surgery*, published in 2018. Dr. Guyuron has published over 280 articles in peer-reviewed journals, 63 book chapters, and 6 textbooks. He currently serves as Editor in Chief of *Aesthetic Plastic Surgery*.

Additionally, Dr. Guyuron has been intimately involved in the education of plastic surgery through his participation in over 1580 presentations at regional, national, and international conferences. He has lectured in over 30 countries and has served as a visiting professor in every respected US medical school. Dr. Guyuron has served as the Director of American Board of Plastic Surgery from 2005–2011 and as the president of 6 organizations including the American Association of Plastic Surgeons, American Society of Maxillofacial Surgeons, Aesthetic Surgery Education and Research Foundation, The Rhinoplasty Society. He has received numerous awards for his accomplishments from every prestigious plastic surgery organization, including the Special Achievement Award from the American Society of Plastic Surgeons, and the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Rhinoplasty Society. He also serves on the board of several civil and public organizations.
